Needs assessment and Implementation barriers and enablers:

E.g. The Consolidated Framework For Implementation Research (CFIR) (Damschroder et al. 2009);
The PRECEDE-PROCEED model (Green and Kreuter 1991)



Potential harm and burdens of process and outcome:

Putting public health ethics into practice: a systematic framework (Marckmann et al. 2015)



Co-creators experience, including perceived sense of usefulness, shared ownership and partnership level:

E.g. Framework for planning and evaluating community participation, collaborative partnership and equity
(Jolley, Lawless, and Hurley 2008)



Feasibility:

E.g. A new prospective for program evaluation (Chen 2010)



Potential for Replication/Adaptation/Scaling:

(Framework for designing and evaluating complex interventions (Campbell et al. 2000), the ADAPT guidance
(Moore et al. 2021)



Effectiveness:

E.g. The HEBS framework (Wimbush and Watson 2000)



Process evaluation, including fidelity:

(e.g. The Medical Research Council Guideline (Craig et al. 2008)
